

Awami League's Petrol bomb tricks to brand the democratic movement of the 20 party alliances as violent/terrorism/terrorist activities

The Awami League led government is plotting an ill conspiracy to create confusion among the people in home and abroad about the ongoing movement of the 20 party alliances. To hamper the democratic movement of the opposition alliances, they are exploding crude bombs and petrol bombs in different places of the country and then lodged politically motivated case against the opposition men in connection with the incidents in a preplanned way. Even they set a worst example of repression by carrying into the civilian houses, messes and by abducting and murdering the innocent opposition activists. Not only the leaders and activist even the ordinary supporters are not spared from the police's inhuman torture. In a democratic country, there can be group of people with dissident views. If the authorities move for wiping dissident forces out that may cause a civil war like situation within the country. Such a chaotic situation can never be justified for a nation.

While, another maneuver is being made to eradicate the opposition quarters from the political field by the shifting the liabilities of petrol bomb attack upon the leaders and activists of the 20 party alliances. But the media reveals some different truths which have exposed the ugly face of the government. Recent media reports claimed, the ruling party leaders have recommended to free the detainees who had been nabbed red handed by the law enforcers on the spot of the violent petrol bomb attack. Already some 500 recommendations have been placed seeking the release of the arrested suspects. Already many of them have granted bail.

On behalf of the 20 party alliances, it had been said repeatedly, that they have no connection with such violent and terrorist attacks. Their movement is totally peaceful and it is being preceded for the restoration of democracy. Begum Khaleda Zia, the leaders of the 20 party alliances and former Prime Minister also demanded exemplary punishment of the miscreants who were involved with such atrocities following a fair and credible investigation. The countrymen want to get rid of this suffocating situation. Actually, most of the incidents of bomb explosion or petrol bomb attacks have been taken place near the police safety net or in such area which are being dominated by ruling Awami League. There are also some questions about the role of the law enforcers in this regard. It is quite clear now that, the ruling party workers are involved with the petrol bomb attack incidents. Though the government verbally talks for press freedom, actually the media is not free in Bangladesh now; this is why; maximum genuine news is being barred to be published. However some news has been published in some media which are given below:

1. 4 Chhatra League activists got injured while making bombs in Roopganj

4 ruling party student wing Chhatra League activists have become injured while making bombs in the Chonab area of Roopganj Upazila under Narayanganj district. The accident took place while preparing bombs in go down owned by Chhatra League Shahin Mia on Wednesday night.

The police claimed quoting the locals that; the local residents heard the sound of a bomb explosion in a go down owned by Chonab Union unit Chhatra League Shahin Mia on Wednesday night. Later police rushed to the spot and came to know that 4 Chhatra League men including Rokmot Ullah, Shahin Mia and Kabir. Off the injured, Rokmot Ullah, the son of 9 number ward Awami League vice president Abdul Hie Mia later admitted into Pongu Hospital of the capital in a critical situation.

2. Chhatra League admits the liability of Petrol bomb and crude bomb explosion

During the 20 party alliances declared blockade and strike, several crude bombs and petrol bombs were exploded in the University adjacent area and the University unit branch Chhatra League admits the liabilities of the incident. The liability has been admitted at 11 in the morning Yesterday from the official page of Chhatra League named ‘Bangladesh Student League, Rajshahi University.’ While, the central president of Chhatra League Badiuzzaman Shohag as usually tried to identify the admin of the page as a Chhatrashibir activist. In a official status of the face book official page, it is stated that, “think brother, what a shrewd tricks, we are hurling petrol bombs and the liabilities are going upon BNP, Chhatra Dal and Jamaat-Shibir. 3. Two Jubo League men arrested with petrol bombs

Police arrested two Jubo League leaders with petrol bombs from the Keski intersection of the Jogonnath Dighi Union of the Chouddogram Upazila of the Comilla district. They were identified as Manik and Babul. Both of the detainees are the Jogonnath Dighi Union unit Jubo League leaders.

The locals and the witness of the incident stated that, the duos have been arrested on last Wednesday at 11 at night.

The officer in charge of the Chouddogram police station Uttam Kumar Chakrawarti denied the claim of arrest and claimed two petrol bombs were found abandoned on the highway. None was arrested. To the latest, the two Jubo League leaders were under police custody.

4. 6 men held in Chittagong with petrol and crude bombs and locally made arms

Border Guard Bangladesh, BGB has arrested 6 men in Chittagong with petrol and crude bombs and locally made arms. They had been nabbed following a raid into Chittagong city’s Tiger pass railway colony area on 2nd February, Monday night.

The ADG of BGB Major Sabbir Ahmed disclosed the information at a press conference held at the regional headquarter of BGB in Hali Shohor area of the port city. The detainees were identified as Jahangir Alam, Osman Gani, Abul Kalam, Harun Mia, Sharif Khan and Md. Munna.

Surprisingly, the BGB official tried to defend the detainees in the press meet. He claimed, following the death of Humayun Kabir Murad, the elder brother of detainee Munna, a vested quarter is trying to harass Munna and his family. He further added, a faction of Jubo League leader namely Mamun, Masum, Ali, Khokon Chandra Tati, Idu and Shumon had filed false case against them and handed them over to BGB.

In the press meet, Major Sabbir Ahmed claimed, getting some secret information, a 30 member's team of BGB had carried operation in the Tiger pass railway colony area and arrested 6 men along with 8 petrol bombs, two crude bombs and several other locally made weapons. Grabbing the land of the railway, these criminals frequently hold meeting, he added. How the arrested Munna rented a government house, he also raised that question. Another BGB officer Major Tanvir Mahmud at that time said, the petrol bombs and other explosives have been brought to create anarchy and violence in Chittagong city.

5. Attempt to torch a bus; 3 Chhatra League activists held

Police arrested 3 leaders and activists of Chhatra League from Paronanduali central bus terminal of the Magura district. They detainees were trying to torch a bus, confirmed the police source. They were arrested at 7.45 pm on Wednesday.

The detainees are: the district religion affairs secretary of Chhatra League Sajjad Molla (24), Chhatra league activist Limon (22) and Rana (19). They were held with two petrol bombs and a match.

Admitting the incident, district police superintendent Zihadul Kabir said to Bengali Daily Prothom Alo that, the detainees were nabbed with two petrol bombs and a match.

District unit Chhatra League President Sheikh Rezaul Islam also confessed that, these detainees are Chhatra League activists and they were facing interrogation in police custody.

6. Jubo League activist held with bomb in Chuadanga

Police captured a Jubo League worker, a faction of the ruling Awami League, with two powerful bombs. The worker was arrested on an anti-terrorist drive at Jibonnogor Upazila of Chuadanga.

Jubo League activist Mizanur Rahman Mizan (34) was arrested from Mafrudah village of the Upazilla on Thursday. He is the son of Fazlur Rahman from same village.

Police stated that he was wandering suspiciously on the road. Later police interrogated him and found him suspicious and as he was searched thoroughly he was captured with two bombs.

Humayn Kabir, Officer in Charge of Jibonnagar, stated that Mizan was sent to jail through court after questioning as he was captured red handed with two bombs.

7. Cocktail blasts at the rooftop of the Awami League leader's house in Khulna

Cocktail and crude bombs had been exploded at the rooftop of Syed Kismat Ali, the 36 number ward secretary of the Khan Jahan Ali thana of the Khulna town. The crude bombs were exploded at around 11.30 pm on Tuesday at the rooftop of his house located in the Atra industrial area of the town. But no casualties were reported. Syed Kismat informed that, he was inside the house during the blast. A crude bomb exploded at the rooftop of the house with massive sound.

The officer in charge of the Khan Jahan Ali police station, Anwar Hossen informed, following the blast, the policemen recovered severe seized materials. Raid is being carried out to arrest the miscreants, he claimed.

8. AL leader's son arrested with petrol bombs

The detective branch of police arrested the son of a Awami Muktiyoddha League leader at Sonar Bangla market of Madhabdi municipality in Narsingdi and recovered five petrol bombs from him on Wednesday afternoon. The arrested was identified as Md Masum, 22, son of Nuralapur union Awami Muktiyoddha League vice president Zehar Ali. Police, quoting local people, said Masum was a miscreant. A case was filed with the Narsingdi sadar police in this connection, police said.

9. Handmade bomb exploded beside Awami League head office; Chhatra League worker held

3 handmade crude bombs were exploded just in front of the Awami League central office at the Bangabandhu Avenue of the capital. At that time, police arrested a Chhatra League activist. The incident took place at noon on Saturday. The Sub-Inspector of the Polton police station Mashiur Rahman has informed the news to Sheershanews.

He informed, after exploding crude bombs on Saturday, several miscreants were trying to flee away. At that time, a microbus driver has caught one of them red handed. The nabbed man claimed himself as the follower of Dhaka city South unit Chhatra League president Anisur Rahman Anis and Organizing Secretary A S M Farez Sami. Later, he was taken to the Polton police station.

The detained youth has been identified as Sadik. The duty officer of the Polton police station ASI Shawkat claimed that, he is delivering irrelevant information.
